The capitol grounds have been used as military facilities since the early 1700s. The area was first inhabited by the French, after being discovered by French explorer Pierre Lemoyne, Sieur d'Iberville around 1700. Baton Rouge was ceded to the British in 1763. The British first fortified the area in 1779, and called it Ft. Richmond. In September 1779, Bernardo de Galvez and his Spanish Louisiana Troops defeated the British and obtained the surrender of three forts on the Mississippi River: Bayou Manchac, Baton Rouge, and Natchez.







Mr. Trent Angers is a veteran journalist who has authored countless news and feature stories, as well as seven books, in a writing and editing career that has spanned five decades.

Three of these books are biographies of American heroes from South Louisiana about whom he will speak this evening. Mr. Angers is the editor and publisher of Acadian House publishing, a book publishing company based in Lafayette that has been operating for 45 years.

For 35 years, he was the editor and publisher of Acadiana Profile Magazine.

Mr. Angers was twice nominated for the Nobel Prize in Literature (2000 and 2001) for his work on the biography of Vietnam War hero Hugh Thompson.

He is also a Third Order Franciscan and a member of the Secular Franciscan Order. Trent Angers, veteran journalist and author was guest Speaker for the Banquet. His topic was American heroes from South Louisiana.

What is the meaning of the Pledge of Allegiance?

One Nation under God—there is no comma or pause

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

The Pledge of Allegiance dates back to 1892. The words "under God" weren't added until 1954. We usually say the pledge like this:

"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation (pause) under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

However, notice there is no comma between "one Nation" and "under God." We say the pledge many times without giving much thought to what it stands for or it's **punctuation**.

The pledge is to be said standing (if able) facing the American Flag. If you are in uniform (male or female) render a hand salute. If in civilian attire place your right hand over your heart. A male wearing a hat should remove it and hold it by your right hand and place over your left shoulder causing your right hand to be over your heart. Females wearing hats are not required to remove them.

He served many years in the Virginia legislature before moving to Northampton County, North Carolina. He made his way to Rapides Parish, Louisiana, where he died on September 12th, 1820.

"On the 6th of November 1970, I was a crewman on an M110 8-inch self-propelled howitzer with Charlie Battery of the 6th Battalion, 27th Field Artillery Regiment. The battery had moved from its previous location at FSB Wade, a short distance outside the village of Loc Ninh, to an ARVN infantry compound eleven miles west of Loc Ninh and two miles east of Cambodia designated as FSB Mateel. On the 8th of November two mortar rounds hit the compound injuring one soldier and critically injuring another. I picked up a M79 grenade launcher and a bandolier of 40 mm grenades and along with Specialist John Maul started off to take up a defensive position on the other side of the compound to return fire if needed. We had run a short distance when a heavy barrage of mortar rounds began to land all around the compound. Two mortar rounds hit approximately twenty vards in front of us wounding me in the abdomen and leg. Our medic Specialist Michael Buller treated me and allowed me to remain in the field."



Our chapter is taking a summer break and will reconvene in September when another venue can be arranged.



Ted Brode spoke to chapter members on the history of **Molly Pitcher**, a nickname given to a woman who fought in the <u>American Revolutionary War</u>. She is most often identified as <u>Mary Ludwig Hays</u>, who fought in the <u>Battle of Monmouth</u> in June 1778. However, another possibility is <u>Margaret Corbin</u>, who helped defend <u>Fort</u> <u>Washington</u> in New York in November 1776.

The deeds in the story of Molly Pitcher are generally attributed to Mary Ludwig Hays, who was married to William Hays, an artilleryman in the <u>Continental Army</u>. She joined him at the Army's winter camp at <u>Valley Forge</u> in 1777, and was present at the <u>Battle</u> <u>of Monmouth</u>, where she served as a water-carrier. Her husband fell and she took his place swabbing and loading the cannon, and was later commended by <u>George</u> <u>Washington</u>. The incident was recorded by <u>Joseph Plumb Martin</u> in his memoir published in 1830.<sup>[1]</sup>

The story of Margaret Corbin bears similarities to the story of Mary Hays. Margaret Corbin was the wife of John Corbin of <u>Philadelphia</u>, Pennsylvania, also an artilleryman in the Continental Army.

On November 16, 1776, John Corbin was one of 2,800 American soldiers who defended <u>Fort Washington</u> in northern <u>Manhattan</u> from 9,000 attacking <u>Hessian</u> <u>troops</u> under British command. Corbin was killed and Margaret took his place at the cannon. She continued to fire it until she was seriously wounded in the arm. In 1779, Margaret Corbin was awarded an annual pension of \$50 by the state of Pennsylvania for her heroism in battle. She was the first woman in the United States to receive a military pension. Her nickname was "Captain Molly".<sup>[2]</sup>





# Robert G. "Bob" Hess, Sr. LASSAR State President 2014-2015 Member of Attakapas Chapter Member of Color Guard NSSAR National Trustee

On March 8, 2024, Robert "Bob" G. Hess, Sr. met Death, shook his head wryly and laughed. After a very short and drastic decline in his health, he died seven days short of his 71'st birthday. Bob was born in Nassau, NY. As a husband, father, and grandfather, he leaves his loving spouse, Katherine Adele Lyman Hess, one son, Robert, Jr., and one grandchild. A man of many interests and proud of his American Revolutionary ancestors, Bob joined the National Society, Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) in 2012 to honor them. He leaves a deep void in LASSAR and the Attakapas Chapter. He is greatly missed.



# SECNAV Names Future Guided Missile Frigate USS Galvez (FFG 67)

21 June 2024

Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro announced that a future Constellation-class Guided Missile Frigate, FFG 67, will be named USS Galvez, June 21.



MADRID – Secretary of the Navy Carlos Del Toro announced that a future Constellation-class Guided Missile Frigate, FFG 67, will be named USS Galvez, June 21.ecretary Del Toro made the announcement while joining U.S. Ambassador to Spain Julissa Reynoso Pantaleón and Chief of Staff of the Spanish Navy, Admiral Antonio Pineiro, in Madrid, Spain, for the U.S. Embassy's Fourth of July Celebration.

The future USS Galvez honors Conde Bernardo de Gálvez y Madrid and his service during the American Revolutionary War. This will be the first U.S. Navy

vessel named for Gálvez.

"Gálvez wasn't just a supporter from afar—his actions directly influenced the course of the war and helped secure American Independence," said Secretary Del Toro. "That is why, in his homeland, I am incredibly pleased to announce that our next Constellationclass frigate, FFG 67, will be named the USS Gálvez."

During the American Revolution, Gálvez provided supplies, intelligence, and military support to the American colonists and led military victories for Spain against Great Britain. As governor of Spain's territory in Louisiana, he covertly worked with American agent Oliver Pollock in 1777 to transfer money, gunpowder, and vital supplies to colonial forces.

In his direct service to Spain, Gálvez recruited an army of 7,500 men made up of Spanish, French, African American, Mexican, Cuban, and Anglo-American forces. In 1779–1780, his forces defeated the British at Battles in Baton Rouge, Louisiana; Natchez, Mississippi; and Mobile, Alabama. In 1781, he successfully seized Pensacola, Florida, and was wounded during the fighting. His contributions were recognized by George Washington as a decisive factor in the outcome of the Revolutionary War. After the Revolutionary War, Gálvez led an effort to chart the Gulf of Mexico, including Galveston Bay, and served as the viceroy of New Spain. In 2014, the United States Congress passed Public Law No. 113-229, granting him honorary citizenship of the United States—making him one of only eight honorary citizens in U.S. history.

The future USS Galvez, the sixth of the new Constellation-class frigates, was appropriated in 2024. The other ships in the class are USS Constellation (FFG 62), USS Congress (FFG 63), USS Chesapeake (FFG 64), USS Lafayette (FFG 65), and USS Hamilton (FFG 66). Secretary Del Toro named the future USS Lafayette (FFG 65) in 2023 and the future USS Hamilton (FFG 66) in May 2024.

Along with the ship's name, Secretary Del Toro announced the sponsors for the USS Galvez will be Ambassador Reynoso Pantaleón and Spanish Ambassador to the U.S. Ángeles Moreno Bau. They, in their role as sponsors, will represent a lifelong relationship with the ship and crew.

"Honoring Bernardo de Gálvez in this way at our Independence celebration marks not only the close, enduring, and historic partnership between the United States and Spain, it also recognizes his and Spain's critical role in the war for America's Independence almost 250 years ago," said Ambassador Reynoso.

The Constellation-class guided-missile frigate represents the Navy's next generation small surface combatant. This ship class will be an agile, multi-mission warship, capable of operations in both blue-water and littoral environments, providing increased combat-credible forward presence that provides a military advantage at sea.

The Constellation-class will have multi-mission capability to conduct air warfare, anti-submarine warfare, surface warfare, electronic warfare, and information operations.
